

Fresh, Organically Grown HOUSE TEAS

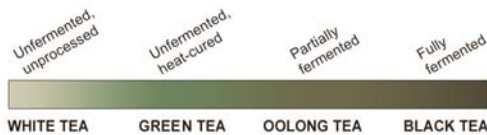
We invite you to experience the freshest green tea...



It is said that the Buddha discovered tea when, fatigued and unable to concentrate, he chewed on the leaves of the tea plant and was refreshed.

Many such legends about the origins of tea appear in ancient Asian and Indian texts, and for many years tea has been the favorite drink of China, Japan and other countries. (Officially, the Second Emperor of China, Shen Nung, discovered tea in 2737 B.C.)

Our teas grow organically in the pure soil and mountain air of Fujian, China. Different methods of treating the new leaves result in the different types of tea. White tea is dried without curing or fermenting, and is highest in health properties but lowest in caffeine; heat-cured teas like green tea are denser and typically have a richer taste; teas that are fermented (oolong and black) have even deeper flavor, color and texture, and more caffeine.
